



New For All Ages

By God's goodness and compassion, the doors of His kingdom have been opened to all who have faith, Jew or Gentile. That's the good news Paul and Barnabas proclaim in today's First Reading. With the coming of the Church—the new Jerusalem John sees in today's Second Reading—God is “making all things new.” In His Church, the “old order” of death is passing away and God for all time is making His dwelling with the human race, so that all peoples “will be His people and God



Himself will always be with them.” In this the promises made through His prophets are accomplished (see Ezekiel 37:27; Isaiah 25:8; 35:10).

The Church is “the kingdom for all ages” that we sing of in today's Psalm. That's why we see the Apostles, under the guidance of the Spirit, ordaining “presbyters” or priests (see 1 Timothy 4:14; Titus 1:5). Anointed priests and bishops will be the Apostles' successors, ensuring that the Church's “dominion endures through all generations” (see Philippians 1:1, note that the New American Bible translates *episcopos*, the Greek word for bishops, as “overseers”).

Until the end of time, the Church will declare to the world God's mighty deeds, blessing His holy name and giving Him thanks, singing of the glories of His kingdom. In His Church, we know ourselves as His “faithful ones,” as those Jesus calls “My little children” in today's Gospel. We live by the new law, the “new commandment” that He gave in His final hours. The love He commands of us is no human love but a supernatural love. We love each other as Jesus loved us

in suffering and dying for us. We love in imitation of His love.

This kind of love is only made possible by the Spirit poured into our hearts at Baptism (see Romans 5:5), renewed in the sacrifice His priests offer in every Mass. By our love we glorify the Father. And by our love all peoples will know that we are His people, that He is our God. Column by Scott Hahn.




MARY & THE SAINTS

One of the statements of faith we make when we pray the Nicene Creed and the Apostles Creed is that we believe in "the communion of saints." The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that this communion (another word for community) includes all the faithful on earth, the souls in Purgatory, and the blessed women, men, and children who are in heaven. This teaching is grounded in our belief that, through Baptism, we are united with Christ and to one another with bonds that are stronger even than death.

And so from the time of the early Church, Christians have turned to other believers for prayers and assistance, including those who have gone before us, confident that God hears the prayers of all of His children. While we ask the saints (and one another) for prayers and support, we remember that the saints join us in prayer. But it is God who blesses and sanctifies us.

When we think of Mary and the saints in heaven, we have to remember that we can turn to them for intercession and assistance because they were faulted, limited human beings, just like us. This means that they are able to understand our struggles, doubts, fears, joys, and hopes. But as we learn their stories, we can also begin to recognize that they stand out in the history of the Church because they persevered in their commitment to follow Christ. Whether they were ordained, vowed religious,

martyrs, husbands, wives, or even children, they show us that holiness is possible. We can follow their example and also benefit from their prayerful support!

We are called to share the blessings we receive. This is also part of our own journey of growing in holiness.

ONE OF SETON'S STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

St. Rita of Cascia, whose feast day is May 22, is in one of Seton's stained glass windows. Rita was born to older parents, and while she desired to join the convent, she bowed to her parents' wish that she marry. The man chosen for her was a brute whom Rita prayed for constantly along with the two sons that their marriage produced. Just prior to her husband's death in a brawl, he came to realize his sinful ways and asked Rita to forgive him. But the sons sought to avenge their father's death so Rita's prayer changed. She asked that her sons perhaps even die before they could commit murder, and this is what happened. Alone now Rita entered the Augustinian convent at age 34. She lived a very austere life in the convent, exceeding the mortifications permitted by the rule for 43 years. She contemplated our Lord on the cross with His crown of thorns so much that a sore developed on her own forehead. Her private garden bloomed with roses and pears even in the winter so she is often featured in art with these symbols. She died of a wasting disease in 1456 or 57 on or about May 22. She is called "the saint of the impossible," and those with especially heavy burdens to bear are encouraged to ask for her intercession. The first life of this saint was written in 1600. She was canonized in 1900 by Pope Leo XIII.


