

Kingdom of Priests

he words God speaks to Israel in today's First Reading are intended for us as well. The Church is the fulfillment of God's covenant promises to Israel—a kingdom of priests and a holy nation (see Deuteronomy 26:19; Isaiah 62:12). In the Church, we have been gathered as the new "Israel of God" (see Galatians 6:16). He has made us His own people, the flock He tends, as we sing in today's Psalm. Moses was Israel's first shepherd (see Exodus 3:1).



With the Promised Land in view, he prayed that God would raise up a successor so that God's people would not be left as sheep without a shepherd (see Numbers 27:17). These same words are used in today's Gospel to describe Jesus' pity for the crowds, who are "troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd." Israel's shepherds—the Pharisees and scribes—had abandoned and misled the people through their hypocrisy and spiritual blindness (see Matthew 23:1–36; Jeremiah 50:6).

But God had long before promised that He Himself would come and save His sheep—searching over the whole earth where they had been scattered "for lack of a shepherd" (see Ezekiel 34:1–24). Jesus is the new Moses and new David promised by the prophets, a divine shepherd-king sent to restore God's priestly kingdom (see John 10:11).

As Moses commissioned Joshua as his successor, so we see Jesus today giving the Twelve His powers and authority (see Matthew 9:35; 10:1). In God's

plan, they are to seek out the lost sheep of Israel first and then bring all nations into the fold (see Acts 13:46; Romans 1:16). Together we have been saved and reconciled to God, as we hear in today's Epistle. As He delivered Israel, He has also made us a kingdom of priests in the Church (see Revelation 1:6). So we come in this Mass to serve Him with gladness, to praise His kindness, which endures forever.

A STATEMENT FROM THE USCCB

From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

"Catholic Christians traditionally recognize June as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. During this time, we call to mind Christ's love for us, which is visible in a special way in the image of His pierced heart, and we pray that our own hearts might be conformed to His, calling us to love and respect all His people.

This year, on June 16—the day of the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus—a professional baseball team has shockingly chosen to honor a group whose lewdness and vulgarity in mocking our Lord, His Mother, and consecrated women cannot be overstated. This is not just offensive and painful to Christians everywhere; it is blasphemy.

It has been heartening to see so many faithful Catholics and others

of good will stand up to say that what this group does is wrong, and it is wrong to honor them. We call on Catholics to pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart on June 16, offering this prayer as an act of reparation for the blasphemies against our Lord we see in our culture today."

FUNERAL LITURGIES & MEMORIAL MASSES?

Everyone has (or will have) questions! It is not a popular topic, but a little bit of education now will serve you well in the future. Before you get all of your answers from the funeral home (which may or may not know what the Catholic church teaches regarding funerals), please read this! This is also available on the parish website for future reference www. stelizabethseton.org/funeral-and-memorial-masses.

Three Parts of the Funeral Liturgy

As the times we live in dictate, it is important that you are well-informed about the funeral liturgy of the Catholic Church, and that you have all options available to you.

The Funeral Liturgy typically consists of three parts:

- the Vigil in the presence of the Body,
- the Mass of Christian Burial (funeral Mass), and
- the Rite of Committal (burial, interment).

Typically, the Vigil takes place at the funeral home, the Mass in the Church, and the Committal at the cemetery.

Purpose of the Funeral Liturgy: The primary purpose of the Funeral Liturgy is to pray for your loved one, who is remembered most especially in The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the One-and-for-all Sacrifice of Jesus given for our salvation. We, as Catholics, believe that this prayer is efficacious and beneficial to the soul of our deceased loved ones, therefore the funeral, and most especially the funeral Mass (the second part) should not be considered a mere "celebration of life," but as a prayer for the repose of the soul of your loved ones.

Eulogies: The prayer vigil, typically held in the evening before the Mass of Christian Burial, is a the time and place to remember and share stories. Eulogies are not permitted at the Mass. If the family would like a eulogy the day of the Mass, it must be done immediately prior to Mass and only one speaker is permitted.

Regarding Cremation: The Holy See issued directives for cremation in 2016. The Catholic Church tolerates and permits cremation, if necessary, for serious reasons. It should be understood that "The Church continues to prefer the practice of burying the bodies of the deceased, because this shows a greater esteem towards the deceased."

If cremation is the course taken, the preference is for the body be received in the Church and for the body to be present for the Funeral Mass and cremated afterwards.

Cremated Remains: We believe that each of us was "fearfully and wonderfully made" by our God (Ps 139:14). Therefore, our bodies, even cremated remains, are treated with the utmost care and respect. They are placed in a sacred space, set apart for being able to visit and pray for the dead. Therefore, the Church tells us:

"The conservation of the ashes of the departed in a domestic residence is not permitted."

"The ashes may not be divided among various family members and due respect must be maintained regarding the circumstances of such a conservation."

"In order that every appearance of pantheism, naturalism or nihilism be avoided, it is not permitted to scatter the ashes of the faithful departed in the air, on land, at sea or in some other way."

"Nor may [the ashes] be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewelry or other objects." Continued on the next page.

Like bodies, cremated remains are not to be intermingled, thus, may be buried/ interred in the same space but in separate containers.

Timing of the Funeral Liturgy: Christian
Burial should take place reasonably close
to the person's death. Planning a funeral
Mass, weeks, even months later because
of family availability or convenience
while the remains are kept somewhere,
uninterred, is disrespectful and undermines
the whole point of the Funeral Liturgy,
which is to pray for the soul of our loved
one. There is always an option of having
the Funeral Liturgy, and then having a
memorial Mass, weeks or months later
when convenient for more family to
attend, but the Funeral Liturgy should not
be delayed.

Weekday Funerals at St. Elizabeth Seton Catholic Parish: Due to multiple Mass times, baptisms, weddings, and other celebrations, as well as necessary cleaning and sanitizing, St. Elizabeth Seton Church is not available for funerals on Saturday or Sunday.

Our Pastoral Staff and Volunteer Funeral Coordinators Are Here for You: Again, please know that when the funeral planning time comes, you have the prayers and support of this parish community. If there is any way we can assist you before, during, or after the funeral of your loved one, please do not hesitate to ask.

Volunteering in the Funeral Ministry is a real gift to others in their time of need, part emotional support, part leadership and part evangelization. If you would like to consider this ministry, please call the parish office.
