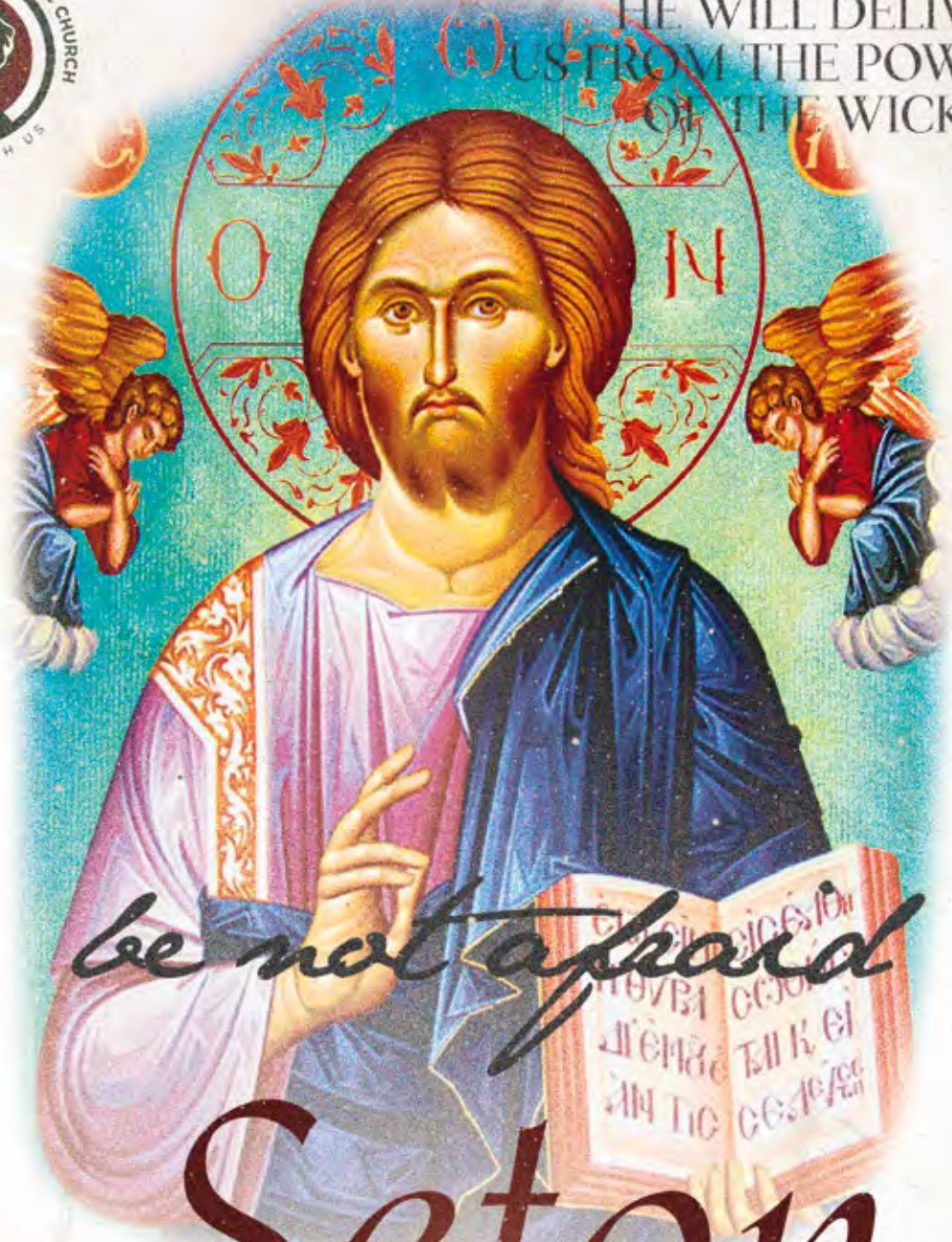

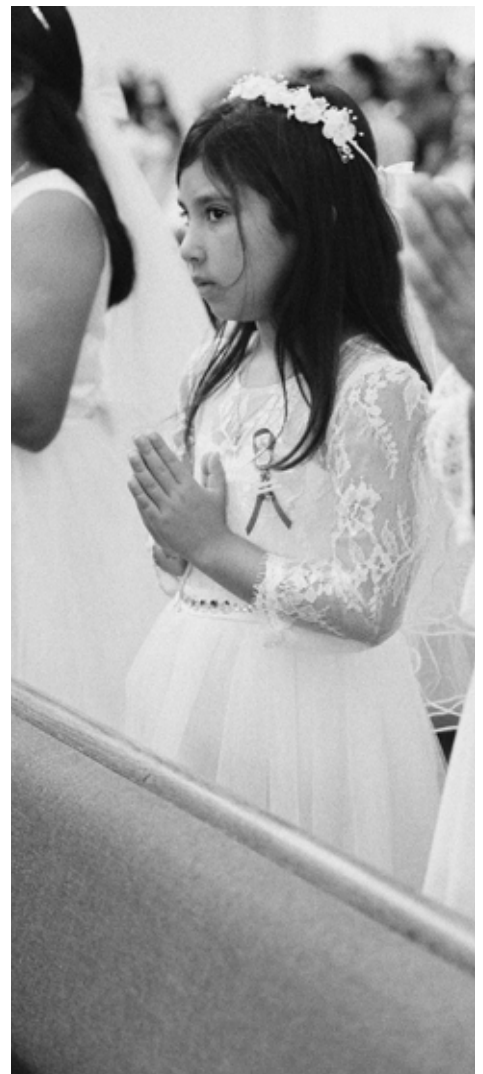

Be Not Afraid



Our commitment to Christ will be put to the test. We will hear whispered warnings and denunciations, as Jeremiah does in today's First Reading. Even so-called friends will try to trap and trip us up. For His sake we will bear insults and be made outcasts—even in our own homes, we hear in today's Psalm. As Jeremiah tells us, we must expect that God will challenge our faith in Him, and probe our minds and hearts, to test the depths of our love.



"Do not be afraid," Jesus assures us three times in today's Gospel. Though He may permit us to suffer for our faith, our Father will never forget or abandon us. As Jesus assures us today, everything unfolds in His providence, under His watchful gaze—even the falling of the tiniest sparrow to the ground. Each one of us is precious to Him. Steadfast in this faith, we must resist the tactics of Satan. He is the enemy who seeks the ruin of our soul in Gehenna, or hell. We are to seek God, as the Psalmist says. Zeal for the Lord's house, for the heavenly kingdom of the Father, should consume us, as it consumed Jesus (see John 2:17). As Jesus bore the insults of those who blasphemed God, so should we (see Romans 15:3).

By the gracious gift of Himself, Jesus bore the transgressions of the world, Paul tells us in today's Epistle. In rising from the dead, He has shown us that God rescues the life of the poor, that He does not spurn His own when they are in distress. In His great mercy, He will turn toward us, as well. He will

deliver us from the power of the wicked. That is why we proclaim His name from the housetops, as Jesus tells us. That is why we sing praise and offer thanksgiving in every Eucharist. We are confident in Jesus' promise—that we who declare our faith in Him before others will be remembered before our heavenly Father.

WHY CELEBRATE THE HEART OF JESUS IN JUNE?

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is an ancient practice. We can see its Scriptural origins in Jesus' own references to His Heart. "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest ... for I am meek and humble of heart" (c.f. Matthew 11:28, 29).

The devotion received a surge of popularity in the late 1600s. Jesus appeared several times to a French religious sister, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, pointing to his heart. During this time, the Jansenist heresy had risen in France, which preached limited predestination for salvation. When appearing to Margaret Mary, Jesus affirmed his love for all mankind: "Behold the Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing." He asked for a special feast celebrating his Sacred Heart on the Friday following the feast of Corpus Christi. Over time, June has become known as the month of Sacred Heart.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,



DO YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS ABOUT...

FUNERAL LITURGIES & MEMORIAL MASSES?

Everyone has (or will have) questions! It is not a popular topic, but a little bit of education now will serve you well in the future. Before you get all of your answers from the funeral home (which may or may not know what the Catholic church teaches regarding funerals), please read this! This is also available on the parish website for future reference www.stelizabethseton.org/funeral-and-memorial-masses.

Three Parts of the Funeral Liturgy

As the times we live in dictate, it is important that you are well-informed about the funeral liturgy of the Catholic Church, and that you have all options available to you.

The Funeral Liturgy typically consists of three parts:

- the Vigil in the presence of the Body,
- the Mass of Christian Burial (funeral Mass), and
- the Rite of Committal (burial, interment).

Typically, the Vigil takes place at the funeral home, the Mass in the Church, and the Committal at the cemetery.

Purpose of the Funeral Liturgy: The primary purpose of the Funeral Liturgy is to pray for your loved one, who is remembered most especially in The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the One-and-for-all Sacrifice of Jesus given for our salvation. We, as Catholics, believe that this prayer is efficacious and beneficial to the soul of our deceased loved ones, therefore the funeral, and most especially the funeral Mass (the second part) should not be considered a mere "celebration of life," but as a prayer for the repose of the soul of your loved ones.

Eulogies: The prayer vigil, typically held in the evening before the Mass of Christian Burial, is a the time and place to remember and share stories. Eulogies are not permitted at the Mass. If the family would like a eulogy the day of the Mass, it must be done immediately prior to Mass and only one speaker is permitted.

Regarding Cremation: The Holy See issued directives for cremation in 2016. The Catholic Church tolerates and permits cremation, if necessary, for serious reasons. It should be understood that "The Church continues to prefer the practice of burying the bodies of the deceased, because this shows a greater esteem towards the deceased."

If cremation is the course taken, the preference is for the body be received in the Church and for the body to be present for the Funeral Mass and cremated afterwards.

Cremated Remains: We believe that each of us was "fearfully and wonderfully made" by our God (Ps 139:14). Therefore, our bodies, even cremated remains, are treated with the utmost care and respect. They are placed in a sacred space, set apart for being able to visit and pray for the dead. Therefore, the Church tells us:

"The conservation of the ashes of the departed in a domestic residence is not permitted."

"The ashes may not be divided among various family members and due respect must be maintained regarding the circumstances of such a conservation."

"In order that every appearance of pantheism, naturalism or nihilism be avoided, it is not permitted to scatter the ashes of the faithful departed in the air, on land, at sea or in some other way."

"Nor may [the ashes] be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewelry or other objects." Continued on the next page.

Like bodies, cremated remains are not to be intermingled, thus, may be buried/interred in the same space but in separate containers.

Timing of the Funeral Liturgy: Christian Burial should take place reasonably close to the person's death. Planning a funeral Mass, weeks, even months later because of family availability or convenience while the remains are kept somewhere, uninterred, is disrespectful and undermines the whole point of the Funeral Liturgy, which is to pray for the soul of our loved one. There is always an option of having the Funeral Liturgy, and then having a memorial Mass, weeks or months later when convenient for more family to attend, but the Funeral Liturgy should not be delayed.

Weekday Funerals at St. Elizabeth Seton Catholic Parish: Due to multiple Mass times, baptisms, weddings, and other celebrations, as well as necessary cleaning and sanitizing, St. Elizabeth Seton Church is not available for funerals on Saturday or Sunday.

Our Pastoral Staff and Volunteer Funeral Coordinators Are Here for You: Again, please know that when the funeral planning time comes, you have the prayers and support of this parish community. If there is any way we can assist you before, during, or after the funeral of your loved one, please do not hesitate to ask.

Volunteering in the Funeral Ministry is a real gift to others in their time of need, part emotional support, part leadership and part evangelization. If you would like to consider this ministry, please call the parish office.
