To Find Our Lives

he liturgy this week continues to instruct us in the elements of discipleship. We're told that even the most humble among us have a share in the mission Christ gives to His Church. We're not all called to the ministry of the Apostles or to be prophets like Elisha in today's First Reading. But each of us is called to a holy life (see 2 Timothy 1:9; 1 Thessalonians 4:3). At Baptism, our lives were joined forever to the Cross of Christ, as Paul tells us in today's Epistle.



Baptized into His death, we're to renounce sin and live for God in Christ Jesus. We are to follow Him, each of us taking up our personal cross, as Jesus says in today's Gospel. That doesn't mean we will all be asked to suffer a martyr's death. But each of us is called to self-denial, to the offering of our lives in service of God's plan.

Jesus must be elevated to first place in our lives—above even our closest bonds of kinship and love. By Baptism, we've been made part of a new family: the kingdom of God, the Church. We are to proclaim that kingdom with our lives, bringing our fathers, our mothers, and all men and women to live as little ones under the fatherhood of God and the kingship of the Holy One. We do this by opening our hearts and homes to the service of the Lord, following the Shunnamite woman's example in today's First Reading. As Jesus tells us, we're to receive others—not only prophets but also little children, the poor, and the imprisoned—as we receive Christ Himself (see Matthew 18:5;

25:31–46). As we sing in today's Psalm, we are to testify to His favors and kindness in our lives. We're to hold fast to the promise—that if we have died with Christ, we shall also live, that if we lose our lives for His sake, we shall find our reward and walk forever in His countenance.



CELEBRATING SAINTS IN JULY

TWO APOSTLES:

 St. Thomas on July 3 and St. James on July 25. St. James, son of Zebedee was part of Jesus' intimate circle as a witness of the Transfiguration. St. Thomas is the Apostle that doubted and demanded physical evidence of Jesus' resurrection.

SAINTS THAT LIVED IN NORTH AMERICA:

- St Junipero Serra on July 1. He was born in Spain and became a Franciscan Missionary to the American Indians. Between 1769 and 1782, St Junipero founded nine missions in what is now the state of California.
- St. Kateri Tekakwitha on July 14. She is the first Native American woman to be canonized. She lived from 1656 to 1680.

SAINTS WE KNOW FROM THE BIBLE AND VERY EARLY TRADITION:

- St. Mary Magdalene on July 22. Mary Magdalene is the first to announce the joyful message of Easter as documented in the Gospel of John, chapter 20.
- Sts. Martha, Mary and Lazarus on July 29. The story of these siblings and their profound faith is documented in the Gospel of John, chapter 11 and the Gospel of Luke, chapter 10.
- Sts. Joachim and Anne on July 26 from earliest tradition, this couple is known as the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary, mother of God.

SAINTS THAT ARE NOW DOCTORS OF THE CHURCH:

- St. Bonaventure on July 15. He died in 1274 and was inscribed among the principal Doctors of the Church in 1557. He and his writings are known for tender piety and profound learning.
- St. Lawrence of Brindisi on July 21. He died at 60 years of age in 1619 and much of his writings exist today. His knowledge of the bible and command of languages is truly a gift from God to the whole church.

A SAINT HONORED AT SETON (WITH A STATUE):

St Ignatius of Loyola on July 31. Ignatius Loyola is one of the founders

of the Society of Jesus, the Jesuits. He wrote the Spiritual Exercises to guide the prayer life and spiritual formation of monks who entered the order.

AND MANY OTHER SAINTS INCLUDING:

- St. Benedict, from 5th century Italy, established 13 monasteries which became secure centers of Christian culture enlivening the faithful everywhere. He is known for The Rule of Saint Benedict which detail how monks should live.
- St. Henry was a German Duke who became the Holy Roman Emperor in 1014. He used his wealth and became a patron of churches and monasteries,
 - supported the Cluniac Reforms, and restored episcopal sees.
- St. Elizabeth of Portugal was married at the age of 12 to an unfaithful king in 1283. She dedicated her life to helping the poor and bringing peace to the kingdom.
- St. Maria Goretti was Italian and died at 11 years of age in 1902 after being raped and stabbed. But she forgave her attacker, Alessandro. He experienced repentance and after serving jail time, he went on to become a Franciscan brother and was present at her canonization.
