Watch for Him

The new Church year begins with a plea for God's visitation. "Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down," the prophet Isaiah cries in today's First Reading. In today's Psalm, too, we hear the anguished voice of Israel, imploring God to look down from His heavenly throne—to save and shepherd His people. Today's readings are relatively brief. Their language and "message" are deceptively simple. But we should take note of the serious mood and



penitential aspect of the Liturgy today as the people of Israel recognize their sinfulness, their failures to keep God's covenant, their inability to save themselves. And in this Advent season, we should see our own lives in the experience of Israel. As we examine our consciences, can't we, too, find that we often harden our hearts, refuse His rule, wander from His ways, withhold our love from Him?

God is faithful, Paul reminds us in today's Epistle. He is our Father. He has hearkened to the cry of His children, coming down from heaven for Israel's sake and for ours to redeem us from our exile from God, to restore us to His love. In Jesus, we have seen the Father (see John 14:8-9). The Father has let His face shine upon us. He is the good shepherd (see John 10:11-15) come to guide us to the heavenly kingdom. No matter how far we have strayed, He will give us new life if we turn to Him, if we call upon His holy name, if we pledge anew never again to withdraw from Him.

As Paul says today, He has given us every spiritual gift—especially the Eucharist and penance—to strengthen us as we await Christ's final coming. He will keep us firm to the end—if we let Him. So, in this season of repentance, we should heed the warning repeated three times by our Lord in today's Gospel: be watchful, for we know not the hour when the Lord of the house will return.

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION)

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) involves four parts:

CONTRITION: A sincere sorrow for having offended God, and the most important act of the person confessing. There can be no forgiveness of sin if we do not have sorrow and a firm resolve not to repeat our sin.

CONFESSION: Naming our sins—aloud—to the priest, who represents Christ and the Church.

PENANCE: The prayers—or sometimes, the good deeds—the priest gives, for our healing and the healing of those we have hurt by our sins.

ABSOLUTION: The words the priest speaks by which “God, the Father of mercies” reconciles us to himself through his death and resurrection, called the Prayer of Absolution.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

Ask God to help you make a good confession. In quiet reflection ask yourself: Since my last confession...

- Did I pray to God, daily and from my heart?
- Did I live and witness to my Catholic faith, joyfully & courageously? Did I take God’s name in vain? Did I curse anyone or make false oaths? Did I engage in superstitious or occult practices?
- Did I attend and participate actively at Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation? Did I fast & abstain on prescribed days?
- Did I respect people in authority? My employer? Did I honor my parents?
- Was I violent or unnecessarily aggressive (e.g., physically, verbally, psychologically, etc.) with anyone?
- Was I prideful, stubborn, or rude with anyone? Did I hold a grudge?
- Did I abuse alcohol, prescription medications, or illegal drugs? Did I overindulge in food?
- Did I consent to, recommend, advise, or actively take part in an abortion? Did I use abortifacient drugs?
- Did I view pornography, entertain lustful thoughts, conversations or actions?
- Was I unloving to my spouse? Did I engage in adulterous activity (e.g., sexual, emotional, virtual, etc.)? Did I use contraceptives?
- Was I neglectful of the spiritual, intellectual, emotional, or physical needs of my spouse, children, or family?
- Did I steal or damage another’s property? Was I honest and just in my business relations? Did I waste time at work?
- Did I contribute to the needs of the spiritually and materially poor with my time and resources?
- Did I engage in gossip? Did I lie? Did I speak poorly of others? Did I judge anyone unfairly?
- Did I envy anyone? Was I jealous of others or covet another’s belongings?

GOING TO CONFESSION

Reconciliation may be face-to-face or anonymous, with a screen between you and the priest. Choose the option that is the most comfortable for you.

The priest gives a blessing or greeting.

Make the Sign of the Cross and say, “Bless me father, for I have sinned. My last confession was...” (give weeks, months, or years).

Confess all your sins to the priest. (If you are unsure or uneasy, tell him and ask for help.)

Say, “I am sorry for these and all my sins.”

The priest gives a penance and offers advice to help you become a better Catholic Christian.

Say an Act of Contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins.

The priest, acting in the person of Christ, then absolves you from your sins.

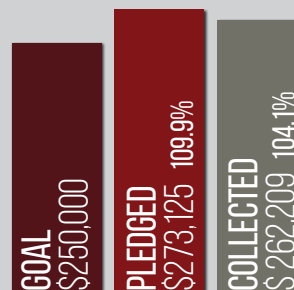

CINCO PASOS PARA UNA BUENA CONFESIÓN

1. Exámen de conciencia
2. Arrepentimiento
3. Propósito de no volver a pecar (enmienda)
4. Confesar los pecados a un sacerdote
5. Después de la confesión, cumplir la Penitencia

PROCEDIMIENTO EN EL CONFESIONARIO USTED DICE

"Bendígame padre porque he pecado", ó bien, Ave Maria Purísima, sin pecado concebida". Hace tantas semanas, meses, años, que me confesé. Prosigue a decir los pecados mortales, cuantas veces le cometo. Si no tiene pecados mortales, entonces confiese los veniales que ha cometido desde su última confesión. Cuando termine su confesión diga: "por estos y por todos mis pecados de mi pasado estoy verdaderamente arrepentido". El sacerdote le dirigirá unas palabras y le dará la penitencia y le pedirá que haga el Acto de Contrición. Espere y escuche cuando le dé la absolución. Después diga: "Gracias Padre", salga del confesionario y haga la penitencia asignada.

HAY DOS TIPOS DE PECADOS MORTAL

Es una horrible ofensa en contra de Dios que destruye la vida de gracia en el alma. Tres simultaneas condiciones deben estar presentes para que un pecado sea mortal: (1) Que el pecado sea grave, muy serio. (2) Que el pecador sepa que eso que va a hacer "es pecado". (3) Que a pesar de saber que eso es pecado, decida hacerlo.

VENIAL

Es hacer un pecado pequeño, una falta leve contra la ley de Dios. Faltar a la Santa Misa del domingo deliberadamente es un pecado mortal.

ACTO DE CONTRICIÓN

*Dios mío, me arrepiento
de todo corazón de todos mis pecados
y los detesto, porque al pecar,
no sólo merezco las penas establecidas
por ti justamente, sino principalmente
porque te ofendí, a ti Sumo Bien

no pecar más en Adelante y huir de toda ocasión

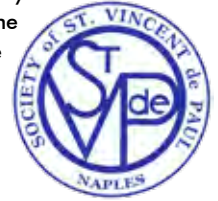

SAVE ON TAXES & MAKE A GREATER IMPACT!

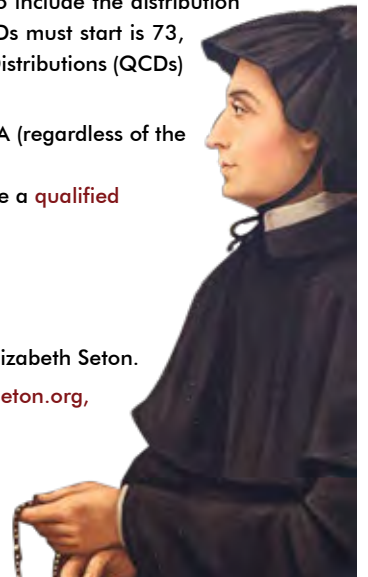
If you have reached the age that you have to take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from your IRA, did you know that you can transfer up to \$100,000 each year from your IRA directly to your favorite Catholic charity, like St Elizabeth Seton Parish? By rolling over your IRA distribution directly to a charity, it qualifies as your RMD and you avoid having to include the distribution as taxable income. Beginning in 2023, the age at which RMDs must start is 73, however, individuals can begin making Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) from their IRAs as early as age 70½.

- Distribute up to \$100,000 in a calendar year from your IRA (regardless of the size of your RMD) directly to the charity, tax free
- If your spouse has a separate IRA, he or she can also make a **qualified charitable distribution up to \$100,000**
- Transfer your **full RMD** or only a portion of it
- **Decide each year** if and/or how much of your RMD to use
- Support multiple charities
