

Raised to Serve

n today's First Reading, Job describes the futility of life before Christ. His lament reminds us of the curse of toil and death placed upon Adam following his original sin (see Genesis 3:17–19). Men and women are like slaves seeking shade, unable to find rest. Their lives are like the wind that comes and goes. But, as we sing in today's Psalm, He who created the stars promised to heal the brokenhearted and gather those lost in exile from Him (see Isaiah 11:12; 61:1).



We see this promise fulfilled in today's Gospel. Simon's mother-in-law is like Job's toiling, hopeless humanity. She is laid low by affliction but too weak to save herself. But as God promised to take His chosen people by the hand (see Isaiah 42:6), Jesus grasps her by the hand and helps her up. The word translated "help" is actually Greek for "raising up." The same verb is used when Jesus commands a dead girl to arise (see Mark 5:41–42). It's used again to describe His own resurrection (see Mark 14:28; 16:7).

What Jesus has done for Simon's mother-in-law, He has done for all humanity—raised all of us who lay dead through our sins (see Ephesians 2:5). Notice all the words of totality and completeness in the Gospel. The whole town gathers; all the sick are brought to Him. He drives out demons in the whole of Galilee. Everyone is looking for Christ. We too have found Him. By our baptism, He healed and raised us to live in His presence (see Hosea 6:1–2). Like Simon's mother-in-law,

there is only one way we can thank Him for the new life He has given us. We must rise to serve Him and His gospel.

Our lives must be our thanksgiving, as Paul describes in today's Epistle. We must tell everyone the good news, the purpose for which Jesus has come—that others, too, may have a share in this salvation.


A BIBLE STUDY ON THE BOOK OF ROMANS BY FR. CASEY

NORMATIVA SOBRE AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA

EL MIÉRCOLES DE CENIZA, 14 DE FEBRERO DE 2024 Y EL VI-ERNES SANTO, 29 DE MARZO DE 2024, SON DÍAS DE AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA. TODOS LOS VIERNES DE CUARESMA SON TAM-BIÉN DÍAS DE ABSTINENCIA DE CARNE.

Todos los católicos de edades comprendidas entre 18 y 59 años deben observar el ayuno el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. En un día de ayuno se permite una comida completa. Se pueden tomar dos comidas más pequeñas, suficientes para mantener las fuerzas, según las necesidades de cada uno, pero juntas no deben equivaler a otra comida completa. No se permite comer entre horas, pero sí líquidos. Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo debe continuar hasta la Vigilia Pascual (la noche del Sábado Santo) como el "ayuno pascual" para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús y prepararnos para compartir y celebrar más plenamente su resurrección.

Todos los católicos mayores de 14 años deben observar la abstinencia de carne el Miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma, incluido el Viernes Santo.

Nota: Si una persona no puede observar las normas anteriores debido a problemas de salud u otras razones graves, se le insta a practicar otras formas de abnegación o sacrificio que sean adecuadas a su condición.

El ayuno, la limosna y la oración son las tres disciplinas tradicionales de la Cuaresma. Los fieles y catecúmenos deben asumir seriamente estas prácticas con espíritu de penitencia y de preparación al bautismo o de renovación del bautismo en la Pascua.

REGULATIONS ON FASTING & ABSTINENCE

ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 14, 2024, AND GOOD FRIDAY, MARCH 29, 2024, ARE DAYS OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE. ALL FRIDAYS OF LENT ARE ALSO DAYS OF ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 years and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is to continue until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.
