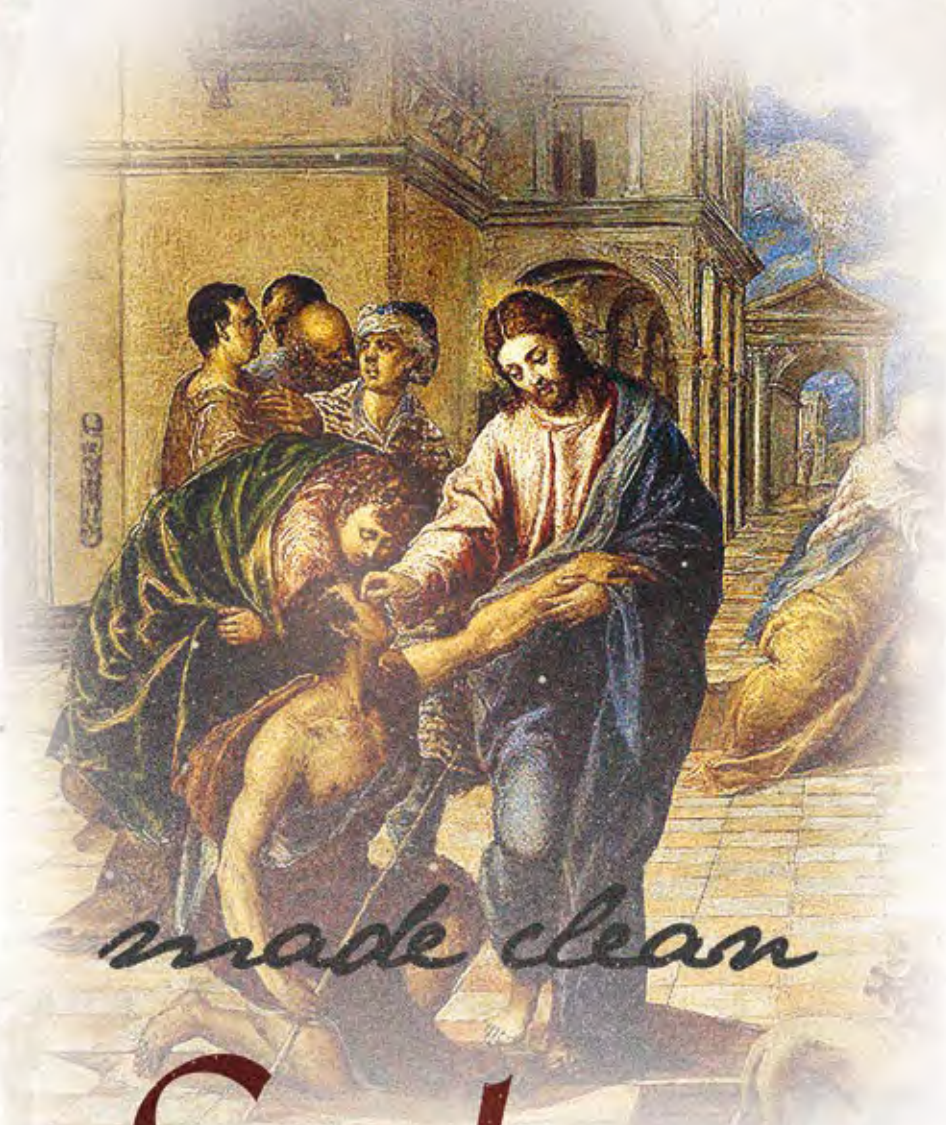

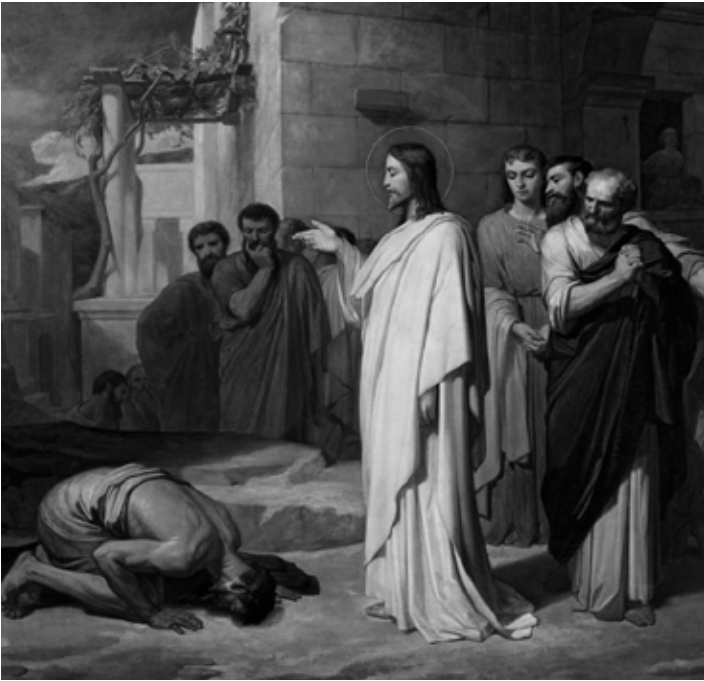

Agnus Dei ministry is a worship driven ministry made up of dynamic young adults that have a desire to bring others to Jesus. Through their gifts of music, preaching, and creating, they build up an atmosphere where people can feel free to worship and encounter God. Through many years of ministry they have been able to refine their gifts and bring to God their best fruits!

They have been fortunate to travel around the country ministering through music and the word. This has shaped their love for ministry and for others.

Made Clean

In the Old Testament, leprosy is depicted as punishment for disobedience of God's commands (see Numbers 12:12–15; 2 Kings 5:27; 15:5). Considered "unclean"—unfit to worship or live with the Israelites, lepers are considered "stillborn," the living dead (see Numbers 12:12). Indeed, the requirements imposed on lepers in today's First Reading—rent garments, shaven head, covered beard—are signs of death, penance, and mourning (see Leviticus 10:6; Ezekiel 24:17).



So there's more to the story in today's Gospel than a miraculous healing. When Elisha, invoking God's name, healed the leper, Naaman, it proved there was a prophet in Israel (see 2 Kings 5:8). Today's healing reveals Jesus as far more than a great prophet—He is God visiting His people (see Luke 7:16). Only God can cure leprosy and cleanse from sin (see 2 Kings 5:7), and only God has the power to bring about what He wills (see Isaiah 55:11; Wisdom 12:18).

The Gospel scene has an almost sacramental quality about it. Jesus stretches out His hand—as God, by His outstretched arm, performed mighty deeds to save the Israelites (see Exodus 14:6; Acts 4:30). His ritual sign is accompanied by a divine word ("Be made clean"). And, like God's word in creation ("Let there be"), Jesus' word "does" what He commands (see Psalm 33:9). The same thing happens when we show ourselves to the priest in the sacrament of penance. On our knees like the leper, we confess our sins to the Lord, as

we sing in today's Psalm. And through the outstretched arm and divine word spoken by His priest, the Lord takes away the guilt of our sin. Like the leper we should rejoice in the Lord and spread the good news of His mercy. We should testify to our healing by living changed lives. As Paul says in today's Epistle, we should do even the littlest things for the glory of God and that others may be saved.

The Holy See has issued a plenary indulgence available to all pilgrims who venerate Saint Jude's relics. What is a Plenary Indulgence?

Explaining a plenary indulgence requires clarifying what sin is and what it does. Two things occur when we sin: 1) we incur guilt, and 2) our soul undergoes deformity.

Sacramental Confession removes the guilt. However, the deformity remains. A person's heart is changed when it sins: sin deforms it. A deformed heart must be reformed in God's image and likeness before entering Heaven. Heaven is, by definition, the realm of the saints. No non-saints exist in Heaven; every soul in Heaven is a saint. Herein is the difficulty. Of those people you have known who have already died, how many were you certain left the world as saints? Most know very few, if any. Yet we are told in the Letter to the Hebrews that no one can see the Lord without possessing holiness (Hebrews 12:14). That is why Purgatory exists: it is a state of purgation whereby a soul is purified through suffering so that it may enter God's presence in Heaven. That the saved may need purification—and are aided by the prayers of the living—is confirmed in 2 Maccabees 12:45: "He made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin."

A plenary indulgence is an act by the Pope whereby he uses his authority as the successor of Saint Peter to declare the removal of one's accrued purgation to be spent in Purgatory (an instance of the papal "power of the keys" described in Matthew 16:18-19). A Catholic who gains a plenary indulgence receives a blank slate in terms of Purgatory up to the moment of attaining it.

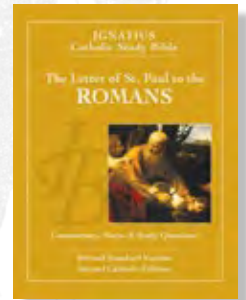

NORMATIVA SOBRE AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA

EL MIÉRCOLES DE CENIZA, 14 DE FEBRERO DE 2024 Y EL VIERNES SANTO, 29 DE MARZO DE 2024, SON DÍAS DE AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA. TODOS LOS VIERNES DE CUARESMA SON TAMBIÉN DÍAS DE ABSTINENCIA DE CARNE.

Todos los católicos de edades comprendidas entre 18 y 59 años deben observar el ayuno el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. En un día de ayuno se permite una comida completa. Se pueden tomar dos comidas más pequeñas, suficientes para mantener las fuerzas, según las necesidades de cada uno, pero juntas no deben equivaler a otra comida completa. No se permite comer entre horas, pero sí líquidos. Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo debe continuar hasta la Vigilia Pascual (la noche del Sábado Santo) como el "ayuno pascual" para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús y prepararnos para compartir y celebrar más plenamente su resurrección.

Todos los católicos mayores de 14 años **deben observar la abstinencia de carne** el Miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma, incluido el Viernes Santo.

Nota: Si una persona no puede observar las normas anteriores debido a problemas de salud u otras razones graves, se le insta a practicar otras formas de abnegación o sacrificio que sean adecuadas a su condición.

El ayuno, la limosna y la oración son las tres disciplinas tradicionales de la Cuaresma. Los fieles y catecúmenos deben asumir seriamente estas prácticas con espíritu de penitencia y de preparación al bautismo o de renovación del bautismo en la Pascua.

REGULATIONS ON FASTING & ABSTINENCE

ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 14, 2024, AND GOOD FRIDAY, MARCH 29 ARE DAYS OF FAST & ABSTINENCE. ALL FRIDAYS OF LENT ARE ALSO DAYS OF ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 years and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is to continue until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.
