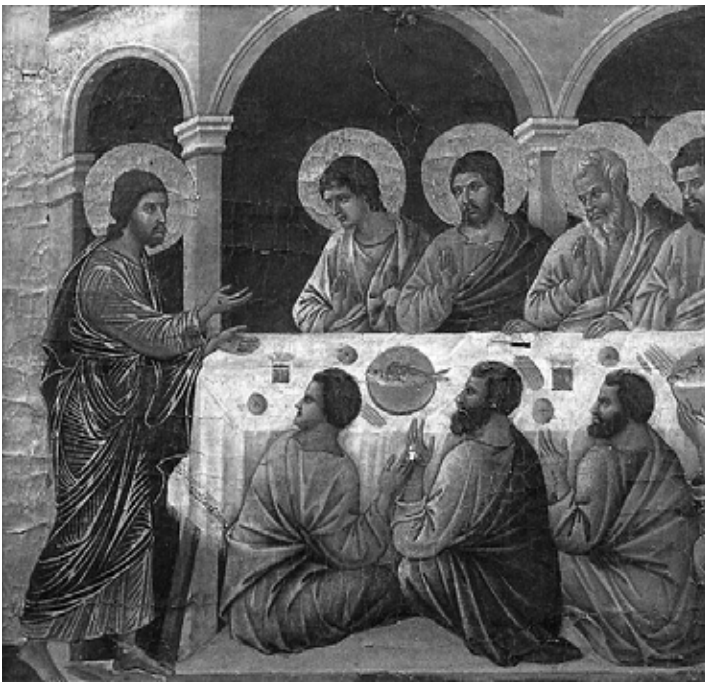

# The Day the Lord Made

**T**hree times in today's Psalm we cry out a victory shout: "His mercy endures forever." Truly we've known the everlasting love of God, who has come to us as our Savior. By the blood and water that flowed from Jesus' pierced side (see John 19:34), we've been made God's children, as we hear in today's Epistle. Yet we never met Jesus, never heard Him teach, never saw Him raised from the dead. His saving Word came to us in the Church—through the ministry of the apostles,



who in today's Gospel are sent as He was sent. He was made a life-giving Spirit (see 1 Corinthians 15:45) and He filled His apostles with that Spirit. As we hear in today's First Reading, they bore witness to His resurrection with great power. And through their witness, handed down in the Church through the centuries, their teaching and traditions have reached us (see Acts 2:42).

We encounter Him as the apostles did—in the breaking of the bread on the Lord's day (see Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 16:2; Revelation 1:10). There is something liturgical about the way today's Gospel scenes unfold. It's as if John is trying to show us how the risen Lord comes to us in the liturgy and sacraments.

In both scenes it is Sunday night. The doors are bolted tight, yet Jesus mysteriously comes. He greets them with an expression, "Peace be with you," used elsewhere by divine messengers (see Daniel 10:19; Judges 6:23). He shows them signs

of His real bodily presence. And on both nights the disciples respond by joyfully receiving Jesus as their "Lord." Isn't this what happens in the Mass—where our Lord speaks to us in His Word, and gives himself to us in the sacrament of His body and blood? Let us approach the altar with joy, knowing that every Eucharist is the day the Lord has made—when the victory of Easter is again made wonderful in our eyes.

## WHERE DID THE FEAST OF DIVINE MERCY COME FROM?

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, “a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come.”



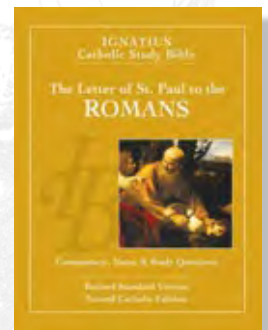

## MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO – ALENTAR UN ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA

### 7 DE ABRIL DE 2024 - 2º DOMINGO DE PASCUA (LA DIVINA MISERICORDIA)

¿Sabías qué? el segundo domingo del Tiempo Pascual fue designado "Domingo de la Divina Misericordia" por el Papa Juan Pablo II, en el año 2,000 durante la canonización de santa Faustina Kowalska. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, en su número 1225, ilumina y catequiza lo que el Papa y santa Faustina nos transmitieron al experimentar la misericordia divina en sus vidas. "En su Pascua, Cristo abrió a todos los hombres las fuentes del Bautismo. En efecto, había hablado ya de su pasión que iba a sufrir en Jerusalén como de un Bautismo con que debía ser bautizado. La sangre y el agua que brotaron del costado traspasado de Jesús crucificado son figuras del Bautismo y de la Eucaristía, sacramentos de la vida nueva: desde entonces, es posible nacer del agua y del Espíritu para entrar en el Reino de Dios". Santa Faustina al pintar el retrato del Señor de la Misericordia nos muestra esta imagen de la misericordia de Cristo Crucificado dada a nosotros por el Bautismo y la Eucaristía.

El Papa Francisco, también, nos lo explica de la siguiente manera: "La misericordia a la luz de la Pascua se deja percibir como una verdadera forma de conocimiento. Se conoce a través de los sentidos, se conoce a través de la intuición, a través de la razón y aún de otras formas. Bien, se puede conocer también a través de la experiencia de la misericordia, porque la misericordia abre la puerta de la mente para comprender mejor el misterio de Dios y de nuestra experiencia personal (16 de abril del 2023).

## LA LARGA TEMPORADA DE PASCUA

El sacerdote sigue vistiendo vestimentas blancas en la liturgia dominical durante el tiempo de Pascua. Si bien celebramos la resurrección de Cristo la semana pasada, el tiempo pascual se extiende cincuenta días (poco más de siete semanas) desde el Domingo de Pascua hasta Pentecostés. Durante la mayor parte de ese tiempo (unas seis semanas), Jesús todavía está con los discípulos, enseñándoles y animándolos. La temporada de Pascua no es sólo una celebración de cuando Jesús está con nosotros. En la Última Cena, Jesús prometió enviar un "abogado" o "consejero" cuando se fuera. En la Ascensión, ordena a los discípulos que esperen el "poder de lo alto": la venida del Espíritu Santo. La Ascensión completa el Misterio Pascual, comenzando con el sufrimiento y la muerte de Jesús y continuando en la resurrección, pero el Espíritu Santo marca el comienzo de una nueva era para la Iglesia.



Después de pasar semanas en oración, ayuno y servicio durante la Cuaresma, puede parecer extraño que no tengamos prácticas similares para la Pascua. ¡Eso no significa que no puedas aprovechar la temporada! Comprométete a aprovechar momentos de poca alegría a lo largo de las semanas, como actos de bondad hacia los demás, una llamada telefónica o una visita. Considere leer los Hechos de los Apóstoles para aprender más sobre la Iglesia primitiva o asistir a una misa diaria durante la semana (8 a. m. en Seton).

## THE LONG EASTER SEASON

The priest continues to wear white vestments at the Sunday liturgy during the Easter season. While we celebrated Christ's resurrection last week, the Easter season extends fifty days — just over seven weeks — from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. For most of that time — about six weeks — Jesus is still with the disciples, teaching and encouraging them. The Easter season is not just a celebration of when Jesus is with us. At the Last Supper, Jesus promised to send an "advocate" or "counselor" when he left. At the Ascension, he directs the disciples to await "power from on high" — the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Ascension completes the Paschal Mystery, beginning with Jesus' suffering and death and continuing in the resurrection. But the Holy Spirit ushers in a new era for the Church.

After spending weeks in prayer, fasting, and service during Lent, it may seem odd that we do not widely have similar practices for Easter. That does not mean you cannot embrace the season! Commit to taking moments of little joy throughout the weeks, like acts of kindness towards others, a phone call or visit. Consider reading the Acts of the Apostles to learn more about the early Church or come to a daily Mass during the week (8am at Seton).

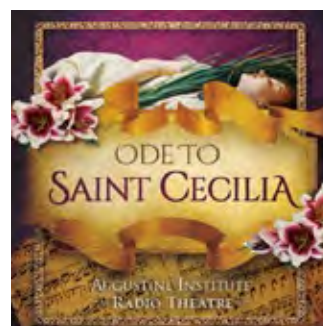
