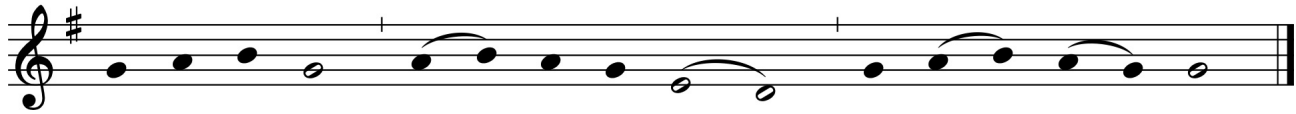

Nicene Creed





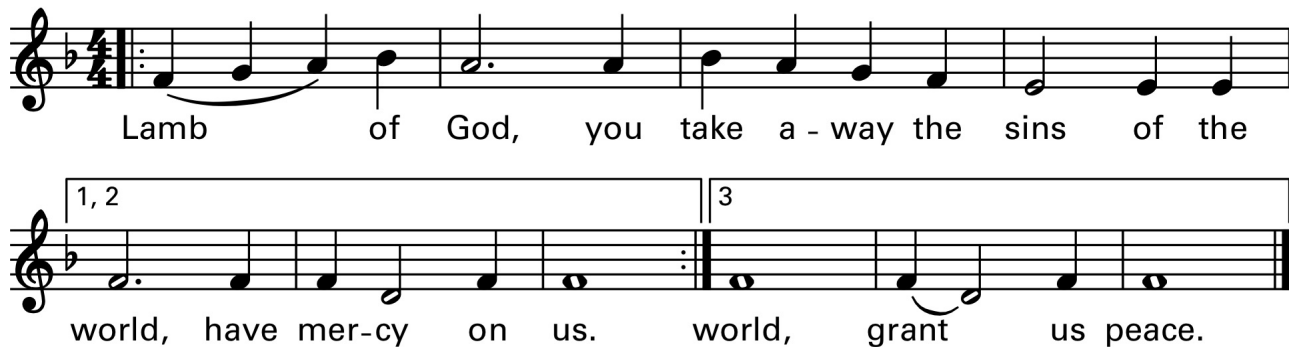
The Lord's Prayer
