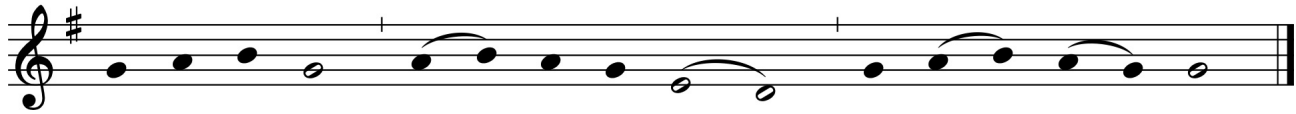

Nicene Creed

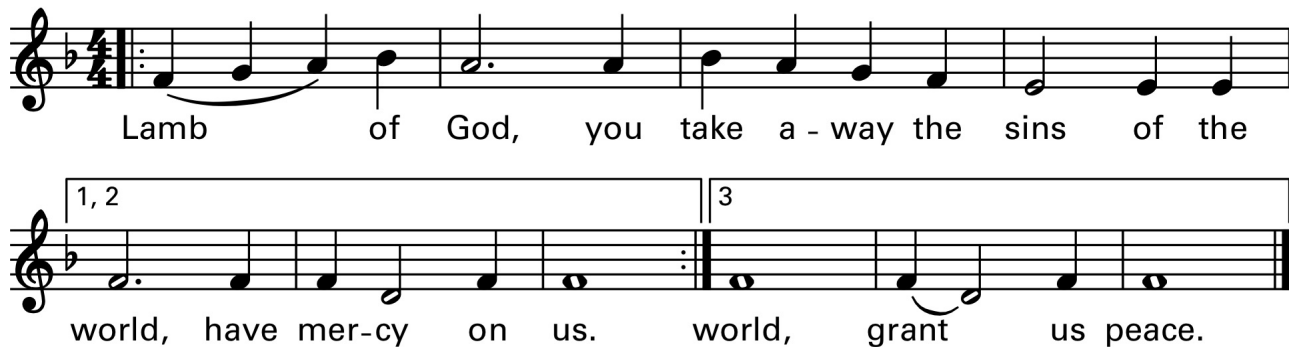
