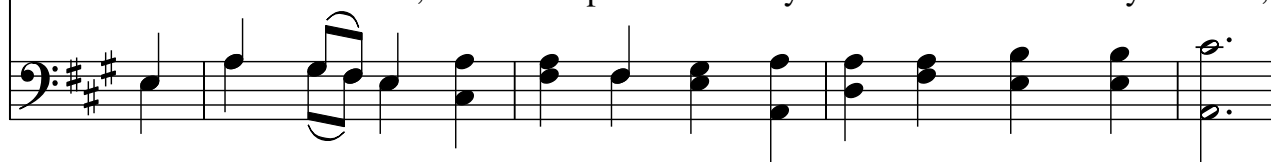
## *I Sing the Mighty Power of God*



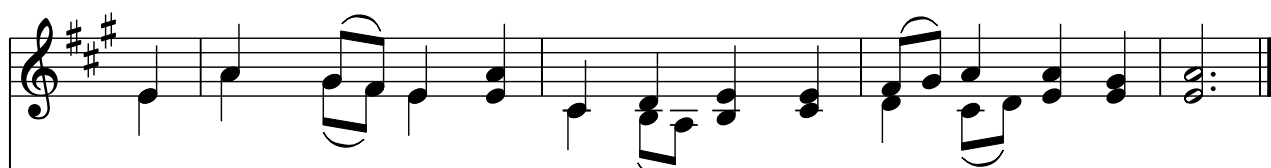
