Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty,

spoken through the prophets.

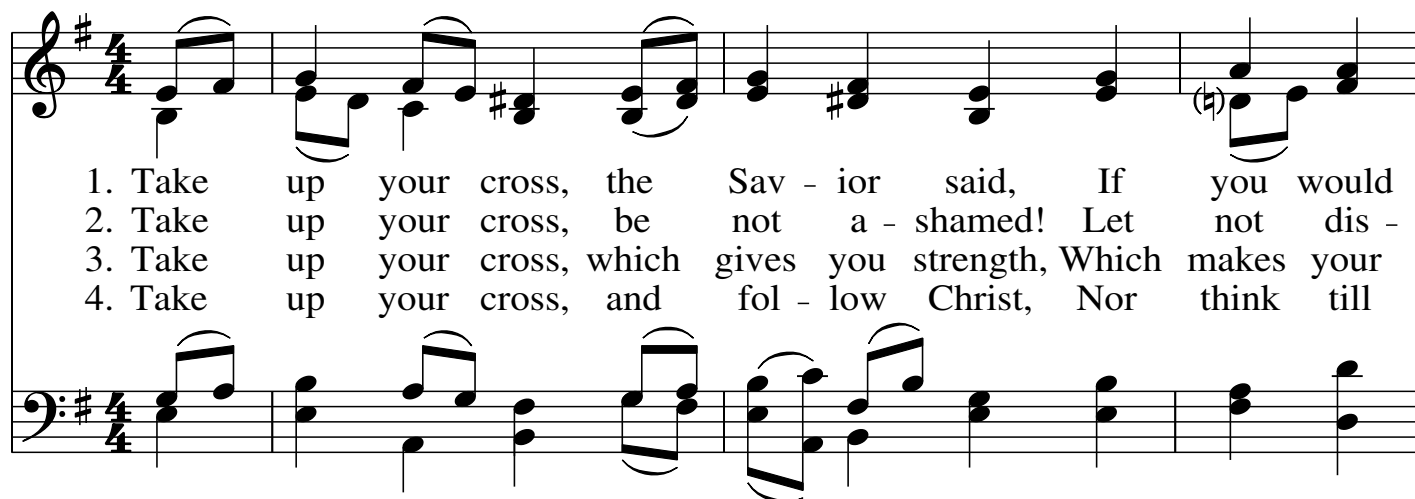
I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the

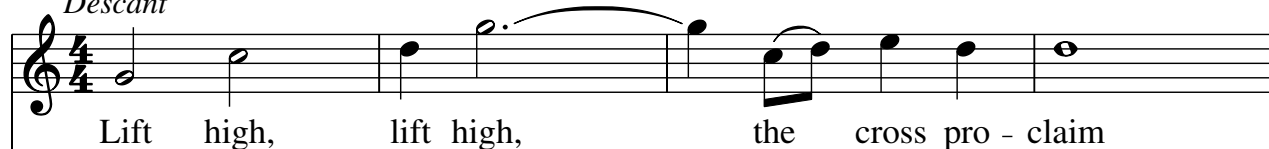

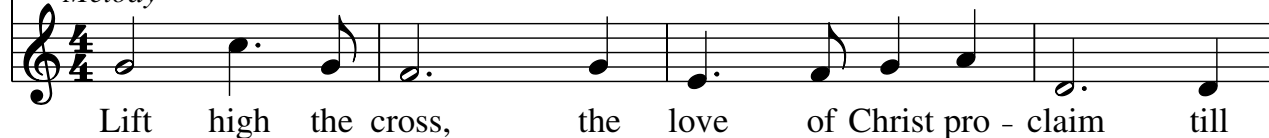

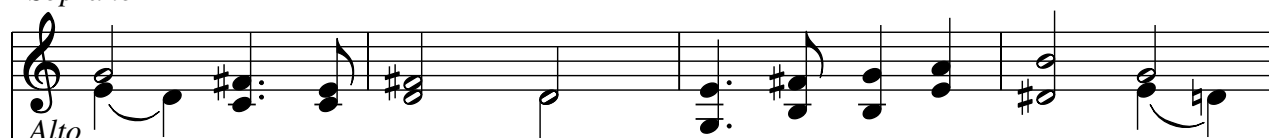
